## **Admission Procedure**

**University Rules of admission and other criteria will  
be put up in the College Notice Board & College Website**

Application forms for different subjects are to be downloaded separately and filled-up complete application forms along with photocopy of mark sheet, Admit of H.S / equivalent examination, Madhyamik admit card, Caste Certificate and P.H. Certificate are to be submitted within the notified date and time.

Merit list will include equal number of seats available in each Honours subject General Course of study. Publication of names in the merit list is not an assurance of admission.

Applicants whose names appear on the merit list will be asked for Counselling and seats will be filled strictly in order of merit from amongst the Counselling applicants. In case seat (S) remain vacant, all applicants who did not avail themselves of the first Counselling, will again be asked for Counselling to fill the seats remaining vacant.

The college authority reserves the right to change/modify the above procedure, if deemed necessary, with proper notification.

The college accepts no responsibilities for cancellation of admission for any other eventuality due to suppression or mis-statement of facts by students at the time of admission and for any admission made inadvertently in contravention of any rule of Calcutta University.

Candidates are to deposit admission fees within the notified date, failing which the admission will be treated as cancelled and the college will not be liable for such cancellation and refund of money deposited in the college after the said notified date.

SC/ST candidates must have proper Caste Certificate issued by the government or receipt from the government confirming that he/she has applied for the requisite certificate.

At the time of verification (Department wise) students must produce, in original,

- (a) Marksheet
- (b) Evidence of age
- (c) Transfer certificate, if required
- (d) SC/ST certificate, if required
- (e) Physically Handicapped Certificate, if required; and
- (f) Two copies of recent passport size photographs.
